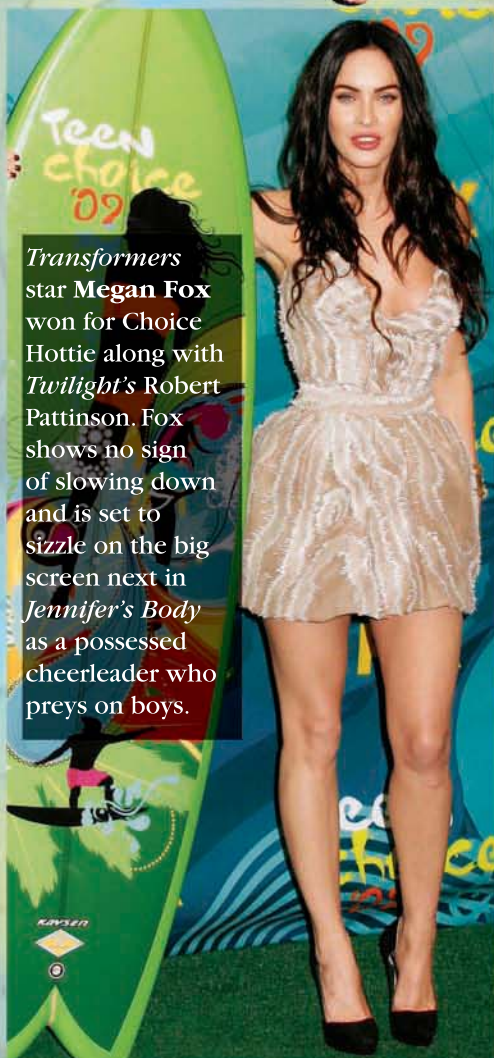

SORORITY ROW

Rumer Willis and Audrina Patridge run from blood and gore in their upcoming horror film

Five girls get themselves in a heap of trouble when they accidentally cause the murder of one of their sisters in a sorority prank. But just when they thought they'd put it out of their minds forever, a mysterious killer threatens to kill them all.

Co-stars Rumer Willis (*The House Bunny*) and Audrina Patridge (*The Hills*) sat down with *Tribute's* Bonnie-Laufer Krebs in Toronto recently to dish on what scares them most and what it was like to work on set with a cast of girls.



How horror movie-savvy are you? Do you even like scary movies?

Patridge: I loved horror films growing up. I love being scared and jumping, hiding under the covers. It's the kind of thing that when you watch one, you can't sleep alone or be alone. They do really freak me out but for some reason I really love that!

What was the first movie that you remember that totally freaked you out?

Willis: My dad [Bruce Willis] showed me *The Exorcist* when I was younger. Not the whole thing, just some of it, but I remember being really scared and I made him leave the lights on all night. But I do love going to the theatre and just jumping in fright—and watching the whole audience being scared is loads of fun too.

Sorority Row is a re-imagining of a film that was made just over twenty years ago. Were you familiar with the original movie?

Patridge: No, when I first read the script I immediately went out and rented the original, which came out in 1983 and is called *The House on Sorority Row*. I thought it was so cool! It was a college movie and it seemed fun, but the *Sorority Row* that we have made now is a little different.

In what way?

Willis: I had never seen the original, and they told us that they'd prefer that we not watch it once we got on set, but what I like about our film is that even though there are some pretty scary moments, ours has a lot of comedy in it. In a lot of horror movies it's usually just gore and I feel like we have a really good mix.

Patridge: Ours is very suspenseful—it keeps you guessing. You don't know who the killer is and, like Rumer said, there are some great comedic moments.

There are six female leads in this movie. What was that like with all of you on set at once?

Willis: We really bonded. We had a fantastic time making this movie. From the first couple of nights we were all hanging out together, we became friends.

Patridge: There was no cattiness or bitching. The first night a few of us went out salsa dancing and got to know each other. Going into it you think, "Oh no, there's going to be six girls, how is that going to work?"

This film is about a prank that goes really wrong, and Rumer, has Ashton Kutcher ever "Punk'd" you?

Willis: (laughs) He actually tested one out on me once, but he never really

made me the victim of his *Punk'd* antics. I always wanted him to but he has a rule: no family members get punk'd. I have to say my whole family just likes playing tricks on each other so we have a good time, although we all have to keep on our toes.

Can we expect some good kills and good gore in this movie?

Patridge: For sure, you will not be disappointed! There's loads of good gore. You're going to jump and have a great time. It's funny, because when you are filming it you don't realize how scary it's going to look.



Willis: Yeah, so when you see it on the screen you are like, "Wow! This is pretty scary stuff."
