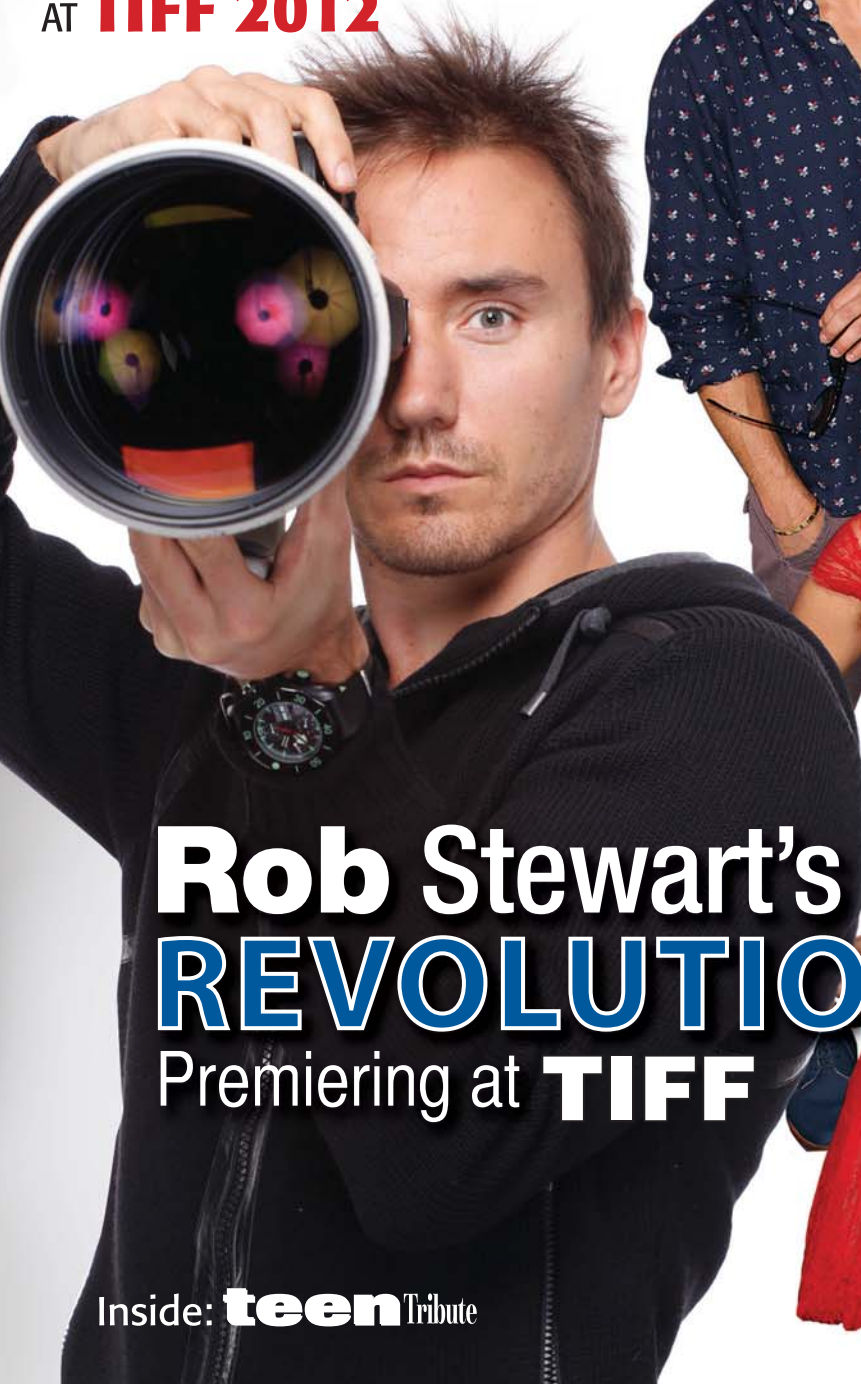

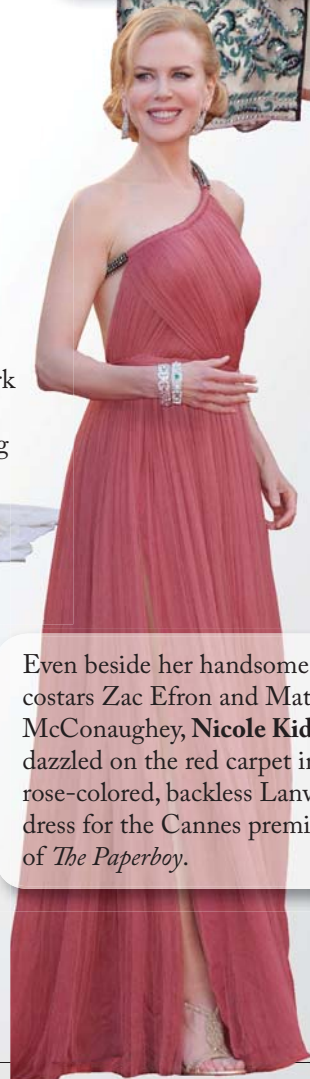

Rob Stewart's new film *Revolution* has a message that needs to be heard. It could be the wake up call needed to save us from extinction.

Rob Stewart's debut film, *Sharkwater*, had its world premiere at the Toronto International Film Festival, where it won a Canada's Top Ten award. The moving documentary went on to win over 35 film festival awards around the world. Rob appeared on *Larry King Live*, *Today Show*, *CNN Live*, *Night Talk* and many more influential TV programs.

But acclaim is not what this young filmmaker is seeking. He wants to open our eyes to what's going on in our world, not just in the oceans where acidification is killing the coral, but on land as well, where the rainforests will be gone if we don't take action.

His new film, *Revolution*, is visually stunning, with breathtaking cinematography, but more importantly, it has a message that needs to be heard.

His message is powerful and at times, a frightening look at where our planet is headed. It's also enlightening and uplifting, because the fight is not over; it has just begun and we have the power to change our future.

The inspiration for the movie came while Rob was fielding questions at the Hong Kong premiere of *Sharkwater*. A young girl asked him what was the point of stopping shark finning if the UN predicts that by 2048, all the fish in the ocean would be gone?

Rob says, "I felt like I'd lost my purpose and the last six years meant nothing. What was going to happen to us if we wiped out all the fish?"

To find out what could be done, Rob met with a number of renowned scientists for an insight and a possible solution. Charlie Veron, who ran the Australian Institute of Marine Sciences for 20

years, explained that the burning of fossil fuel (a natural fuel such as coal, oil or gas)

is creating carbon dioxide, which is being absorbed into the ocean and causing ocean acidification. This is killing the coral reefs. Vernon states, "All humanity for all future will not see coral reefs as I have."

Hoping for a solution, Rob traveled to

Copenhagen for a conference with the world's top climate scientists. He went to Washington, D.C. to take part in a demonstration

to stop coal power plants, the single biggest source of carbon dioxide.

Asked to MC at *Powershift Canada* in Ottawa, Rob told the crowd: “There’s nothing more important than conservation because conservation is the preservation of human life on earth.”

In Madagascar, where overpopulation has led to starvation and people are over-using the resources in an effort to survive, Rob saw some of the country’s last forests being burned and realized, “We don’t just have a carbon problem, we have a people problem.”

The world population is seven billion and growing. “We are the most dominant force on earth, shaping the planet and life in the process. We’re causing the extinction of more species than have gone extinct in the last 65 million years. All signs say we could be a part of that extinction, unless we do something drastic.”

Rob joined the Canadian youth delegation at the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Cancun, Mexico where multiple people spoke about environmental issues and the overall inability of countries to agree on how to address climate change.

The majority of countries, including Canada, do very little to make a positive difference regarding climate change issues. Rob learned that governments are not going to make the necessary steps without pressure. The public needs to become vocal and involved.

But this film is not a bleak portrait of the world—it shows how much hope there is, thanks to people who want to make a difference.

Rob realized after filming *Sharkwater* that making a difference is possible. *Sharkwater* inspired people around the world to make a change.

One of the most moving moments in the film is when a sixth grade teacher in Saipan calls Rob to tell him how inspired her class was after watching *Sharkwater*. They wrote a letter to the governor and asked him to stop the cruel practice of shark finning in their country, to save sharks from extinction. Rob was invited to watch the governor sign the bill.

Over 100 countries have banned shark finning since the release of *Sharkwater*, and most of the movements were led by kids.

Revolution is a ray of hope for the future, showing how much can be done, when we make change. It makes its world debut at the Toronto International Film Festival and opens in theaters in 2013.

ARGO

How did the CIA, Hollywood and the Canadian government manage to team up and save the day? The rescue mission comes to life on the big screen in Ben Affleck's new political thriller.

November 4, 1979. Islamist militants invaded the American Embassy in Tehran, taking 66 American hostages. Six who managed to escape were hidden by Canadian Ambassador Ken Taylor and Canadian Immigration Officer John Sheardown in their homes. The rescue mission that resulted from the combined efforts of the Canadian government and the CIA would go down in history as the “Canadian Caper.” Now, Ben Affleck is bringing the story to the big screen in *Argo*—his third directorial project.

This real-life story depicts how the Americans remained in hiding for weeks, fearing capture and execution. With military helicopters passing overhead and Revolutionary Guards patrolling the streets—not to mention an anonymous caller who phoned the Taylor residence asking for two of the hidden Americans by name before hanging up—the situation seemed bleak.

Then, CIA exfiltration specialist Tony Mendez was enlisted. Mendez, played by Affleck, set up a fake Hollywood production company, planning to disguise the Americans and pass them off as a Canadian film crew scouting the Middle East for locations for an “upcoming” Hollywood sci-fi blockbuster called *Argo*. With the government out of options, the absurd plan moved forward as a last-ditch effort to rescue the diplomats.

The trick? Prime Minister Joe Clark called a secret emergency session at Parliament—the first since the second World War.

The result was that permission was granted to issue falsified Canadian passports for the six Americans, hoping it would help them escape detection long enough to return home safely.

Bryan Cranston—who plays Affleck's boss, Jack O'Donnell, in the film—spoke highly of the project with *Collider*. “I'm so thrilled to have been a part of *Argo*,” he explains, “because it's historically important; it's a true story, it's exciting, it's human endurance and you really root for people to succeed in a just cause. It's really a great American movie, and I think it's going to be a very important one.”

Affleck, who made his directorial debut with *Gone Baby Gone*, became attached to the project after reading Chris Terrio's screenplay, which was based on Joshuah Bearman's *Wired* article, “How the CIA Used a Fake Sci-Fi Flick to Rescue Americans from Tehran.”

Cranston admits he was pleasantly surprised by Affleck's abilities behind the camera. “I must confess that—perhaps because of his exploits when he was younger—I didn't really know what to expect,” Cranston recalls, “but what I found was a really smart, prepared, engaging, encouraging director who I think is going to be the next Clint Eastwood, as far as actors who become directors.”

Argo makes its world premiere at the Toronto International Film Festival this September and opens wide in theaters October 12, 2012.

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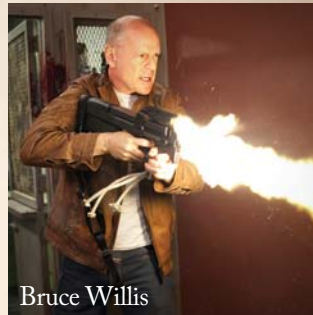
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Joseph Gordon-Levitt and Bruce Willis return to the science-fiction genre in *Looper*—and they're playing the same character.

LOOPER

If you had to kill your future self to save your present one, could you do it? That's the question that writer/director Rian Johnson's latest film, *Looper*, asks its audience, and it does it in the boldest way possible: by casting Joseph Gordon-Levitt and Bruce Willis as past and future versions of the same character.

Set in 2072, this sci-fi/action film follows Gordon-Levitt as a man named Joe who—alongside his fellow “Loopers”—works for a mafia syndicate that operates 30 years in the future. Whenever they need to dispose of somebody, the syndicate simply sends them back 30 years to where Joe and his team are waiting to eliminate them.

If that all sounds a bit difficult to wrap your head around, don't worry; Johnson has no interest in delving into the impossibly paradoxical nature of the time-travel genre.

“In this movie, my model for how to use time travel was very much like the first *Terminator*,” revealed Johnson at the Comic-Con panel for the film. “It's a very different film than the first *Terminator*, but time travel sets up the situation with these characters and then gets out of the way. It's really about the situation and these people dealing with it for the rest of the movie.”

The situation he's referring to is the confrontation between Joe and his older self (Bruce Willis), who one day appears out of the future as his newest mark for assassination. When Joe's older self takes advantage of his shock in order to escape, the younger Joe must hunt down and eliminate the target before the syndicate comes after him, too.

“Could you kill your future self if you had to?”

To make Gordon-Levitt look more like a younger version of Willis, he had to undergo three hours of makeup every morning before shooting. “It's not an impersonation,” explained Gordon-Levitt at the WonderCon panel earlier this year, “but it's definitely a character based on Bruce, so I got to know him, and I got to know him pretty well. We hung out a lot.”

From there, the actor's strategy for finding the Bruce inside himself was simple: just study the man's work. “I'd watch his movies a lot, and I'd strip the audio out of the movies and put them on my iPod so I could listen to his voice over and over again.”

So how did Gordon-Levitt manage to land himself a role as a young Bruce Willis? Well, it turns out the role was written specifically for him after he worked on Johnson's debut feature, *Brick*. “That's the first time that's ever happened to me,” Gordon-Levitt said, “that a writer wrote something for me to play. That was a real honor, and it meant a lot to me.”

And though Johnson might not be a household name yet, Gordon-Levitt says it's just a matter of time. When comparing the director to other filmmakers he's recently worked with—specifically, Christopher Nolan and Steven Spielberg—he noted a definite similarity. “Those three directors actually have quite a lot in common, and I think, when all is said and done, they will talk about him in very much the same way that they do talk about Chris and Steven.”

So, could the filmmaker kill his future self if he had to? “Not if my future self was Bruce Willis,” laughs Johnson.

Emma Watson

— Life beyond Hogwarts

Thanks to her start in *Harry Potter*, Emma Watson has taken her career to new heights.

She may have grown up on the silver screen as Hermione Granger, but British actress Emma Watson is far more than a one-trick pony. At 22, the *Harry Potter* star already has a long list of accomplishments including 12 feature films, over 20 nominations and 12 film awards. But it doesn't stop there! Her role as Miss Know-It-All Hermione has rocketed her career in both film and now fashion, making her a household name.

Like many young children, Emma had big dreams. By age six, she already knew she wanted to be an actress. Three years later, having played the lead in a number of school plays at the private all-girls school she was attending, she got the chance of a lifetime when casting agents found her through her drama teacher and asked her to audition for *Harry Potter and the Philosopher's Stone*. With no prior professional acting experience, Emma snagged the coveted role of Hermione after 11 auditions. Although thousands of girls auditioned for the part, it was Emma's confidence that caught the attention of producers.

After playing the same role for ten years, Emma admitted, "I'd like to play some American high school girl. I want to play something totally different. I want to play every kind of character and every point of view." It looks like Emma has gotten her wish. This September, the actress will appear in her first post-*Harry Potter* starring role in *The Perks of Being a Wallflower*. Sporting an American accent, Emma plays high school senior Sam.

Emma has also immersed herself in the world of fashion. In 2009, the actress held the position of creative advisor for People Tree, an environmentally-conscious fashion brand. Emma stated, "I love fashion. I think it's so important because it's how you show yourself to the world." Her spring line was released the following year and was described by *The Times* as being "very clever."

But that's not all. She made her modelling debut in Burberry's 2009 Autumn/Winter campaign and also appeared in their 2010 Spring/Summer campaign with her brother Alex. Plus, in 2011, Emma continued her involvement with fashion advertising when she became the new ambassador for Lancôme.

In doing so, she follows in the footsteps of Penélope Cruz, Kate Winslet, and her idol, Julia Roberts.

With upcoming films like *The Bling Ring* alongside Kirsten Dunst and *The End of the World* with Jonah Hill and Jason Segel, Emma is one busy actress! With all this fame, Emma confessed, "I hope my head doesn't get very big. I'm just going to keep my feet on the ground, stick to friends and family, and try to lead a normal life." From actress to Burberry model to Lancôme ambassador, there's no doubt this girl's a star. The *Harry Potter* franchise may be over, but Emma's career is still soaring.

Victoria Justice, Thomas McDonell, Josh Pence, Chelsea Handler, Johnny Knoxville

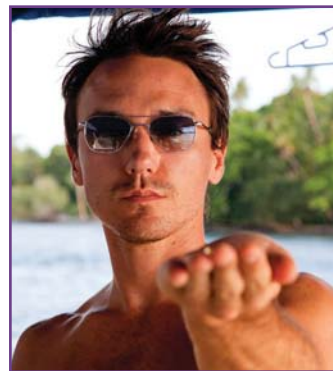

HOW IT ALL BEGAN

Rob Stewart was sent to the Galapagos Islands with a single assignment: to photograph sharks. Instead, he made a discovery that changed his life. He learned the animals were being slaughtered by illegal fishing practices, often just for their fins, and then thrown back into the water to die slowly. It was in this moment that Rob's first documentary, *Sharkwater*, was born.

Released in 2007, the film was Rob's way of educating people about sharks and the important role they play in our world's oceans. It has since been seen by over 124 million people and has sparked political change around the globe. When it first came out, laws about shark finning only existed in 16 countries. Today, shark finning is banned in over 100 cities and countries including Toronto, California, Hawaii, Saipan and Guam. Many celebrities have also joined the fight, including Sir Richard Branson and Leonardo DiCaprio.

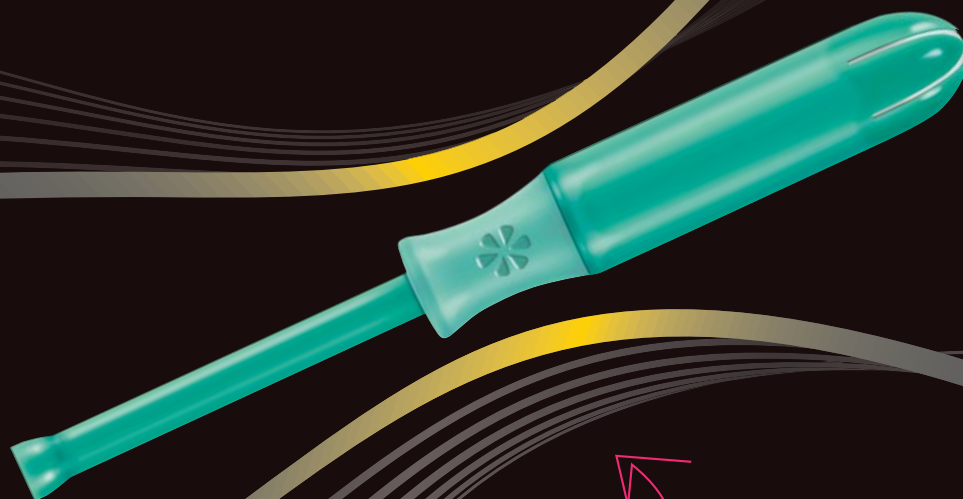

Connor Jessup: From horses to aliens to juvy

At 13, he became a TV star in *The Saddle Club*. At 15 he produced a feature film. Now he stars in the sci-fi series *Falling Skies*, by executive producer Steven Spielberg.

Connor Jessup first gained fame when he was cast in the TV series *The Saddle Club*. Working daily gave Connor focus. "Before that, this business had been more of a hobby, but within those eight months [that it took to film the series] it became the primary focus of my life and it really pushed me in the direction of wanting to be in this business for good," he revealed during an interview with *Tribute*.

Following *The Saddle Club*, Connor attended film camp where he met film school grads. "They had a script called *Amy George* and it was amazing. I wanted to get involved so I donated money and ran around set and did every kind of menial labour job that needed to be done. I think my titles were executive producer/camera assistant. The movie got into TIFF and a bunch of film festivals around the world. It was just a really amazing experience and it introduced me to the world of filmmaking. Not long after that I made my first short."

Connor wrote, produced and directed the six-minute film *I Don't Hurt Anymore!*, about ambition and jealousy and what these emotions can drive people to do.

When asked to describe the film, he admitted, "It's kind of gruesome. I was obsessed with long, continuous shots where tension builds. I think I overdid it a bit! But no one is judging you when you're 16. It's just a great way to experiment and learn."

In 2011, Connor was cast in a lead role as Ben Mason in the series *Falling Skies*, airing in Canada on Super Channel. During the first season, he was rescued from aliens. Connor describes his character: "He's picking up a gun and becoming colder and more distant. He's just really confused and angry but more than anything I think he's afraid of what's happening to him."

Connor has also completed a role in the Canadian movie *Blackbird* (screening at TIFF) as a creative teen whose actions are misunderstood when something he writes is misinterpreted as a "hit list." Connor describes the premise: "He likes this girl, but she has a boyfriend, so when she gives him the cold shoulder in public, it makes him angry. In frustration he writes a short story, which presents a Columbine-esque scenario. The authorities think it's a plan and send him to a juvenile detention centre, but he doesn't fit in. He's naïve, innocent and bookish. It's about how this experience changes everything about him. It's kind of a classic coming-of-age story in an interesting setting."

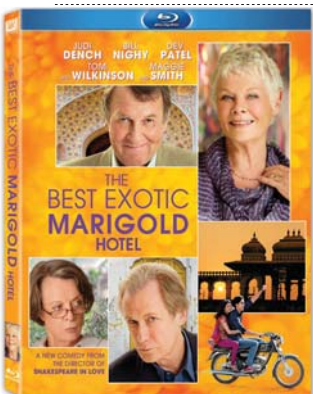

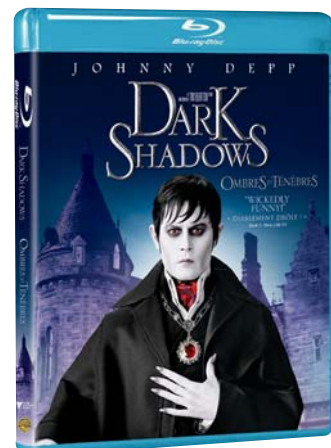

Sony RX100

Sony's new Cyber-Shot DSC-RX100 is one sweet camera. The sleek design and metal construction is comfortable to hold and small enough to pocket. It provides all the manual controls to please even demanding photographers in an interface that beginners and pros will appreciate.

I was delighted by the results from my daytime and night shoots. Part of the formula is a large 20 megapixel sensor that's about four times the size of other point and shoots. Using Sony's latest processing technology, the results are beyond impressive, even compared to larger and more expensive cameras.

For the pro look of sharp focus subjects with blurry backgrounds, sensor size matters more than megapixels.

Thanks to the RX100's wide aperture Zeiss lens, this camera takes photos no point-and-shoot camera can match.

The RX100 is amazing in low light, taking great food pix in nearly-dark restaurants without a flash.

Sony's terrific panorama mode as well as fun and creative effects like watercolor, miniature and HDR (and their options) take your photos way beyond apps like Instagram.

The RX100 is not perfect—the optical zoom is only 3.7x, and the screen doesn't tilt or swivel. Those are small imperfections for a camera that's at the top of my "Want One" list.

Everyone knows the headphones that come with our devices sound barely acceptable and break easily. So we're all in the market for a good set of headphones.



After two weeks of listening, SMS Audio's STREET by 50 over-the-ear headphones impressed me with their powerful sound. The cord, which includes a mic, is of high quality and detachable should it need to be replaced.

Although designed to benefit 50 Cent's music, his headphones provide a full and natural listening experience across a wide range of music. Highs are crisp but not brittle, the mid-range is clear and bass is solid and powerful without feeling exaggerated. You can crank up the volume on 50 Cent's "Candy Shop" or "In da Club" without distortion, or turn it down and still experience a full, rich sound.

These headphones don't feature active noise-cancellation, but their large over-ear design and thick, comfortable foam ear cushions provide good isolation even at low sound levels.

Who was the first celebrity you worked with?

One of my first big shoots was with [British model] Yasmin Le Bon for a *Vogue* cover. From there I think it went to Cindy Crawford. I got a *Harper's Bazaar* cover and then an *Elle* cover and that was how it snowballed. Literally all of a sudden I became this go-to young guy for celebrity covers.

Do some celebrities need more makeup and if so, why?

Insecurity, that's usually why I get booked—because I'm quite renowned for doing real skin—wearable looks that are fast but still very beautiful. Within the celebrity industry there is a lot of insecurity. People don't think celebs read magazines that have the best-dressed lists and so on, but they do. And even though everyone has a good old giggle, when they see themselves on the page they're like, "Oh, okay."

Who are your favorite celebrities to work with?

Cindy Crawford, because she elevated

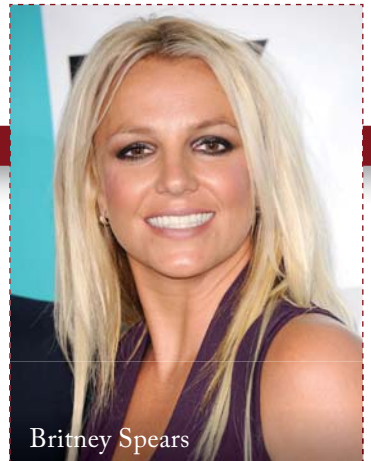
my career by choosing to work with me and requesting me for high profile jobs. I still have a soft spot for Cameron Diaz, even though I haven't worked with her in a while. I worked for Britney Spears a lot in her early days, and she was always one of my favorites because I think she had a good family background and she was always very polite. Was there anyone you didn't like working with?

I remember when Shannen Doherty was at the height of her career and she was supposedly this nightmare. She was in London promoting *Charmed* and she requested me. Well you know what? She's a very confident, determined, strong woman, but she knew what she did and didn't want and where she was prepared to meet you halfway.

I thought, "Okay, she's probably just worked with people who just can't handle that type of confident woman so then you get the bad publicity." When I worked with her, we had a really good time.

What is the most important feature for a woman to highlight?

Finding your best point, because looks vary. If you have fantastic cheek bones and a thin lip, then play up the cheek bones and your brows and that will lift the whole face; it'll draw attention away from your lips.

If you have really full lips but a round face, play up the lip and the outer corners of the eyes and that will bring the face into balance.

For a really long face, try to avoid too much vertical blush. Instead apply a bronzer horizontally into a cross because that actually widens the face and stops it from looking too long. It's just really looking in the mirror and being your own critic.

How did you become a spokesperson for *The Body Shop* and how important is it to use cruelty-free makeup?

As a freelance editorial makeup artist I always used *Body Shop* with other brands when I was doing my photo shoots because not only are their products wonderful, I absolutely love animals and at that time the awareness of cruelty-free makeup or not testing on animals was not a priority with most companies.

What would you recommend women wear on a daily basis?

Always a pop of color on the cheeks and a little wash of color on the lips and the brows—more important for me is the brows. People tend to forget the brows, so they use mascara and eye makeup and then there's no balance between the forehead and the eye line.

Then a nice sheer glaze on the lips, that's all you need and then if you're going from the office to a party, a darker shade smudged across the top lids, a little more black mascara.

If you don't have to wear foundation, don't. I don't like anything too powdered or heavy or masklike, it just brings the whole face down. When I'm working on celebrities, sometimes I just do minimum foundation and they're like, "Are you sure?" And I'm like, just trust me, and then when they see it themselves on film or people see it, they're like, "Oh wow, you just look so fresh and radiant." To me that's one of the key things. It's all about radiance and inner glow.

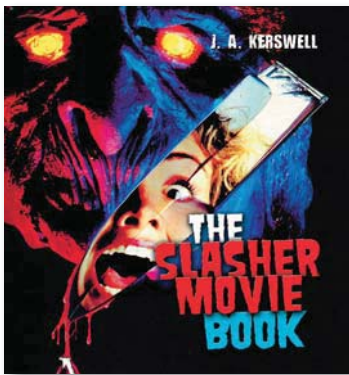

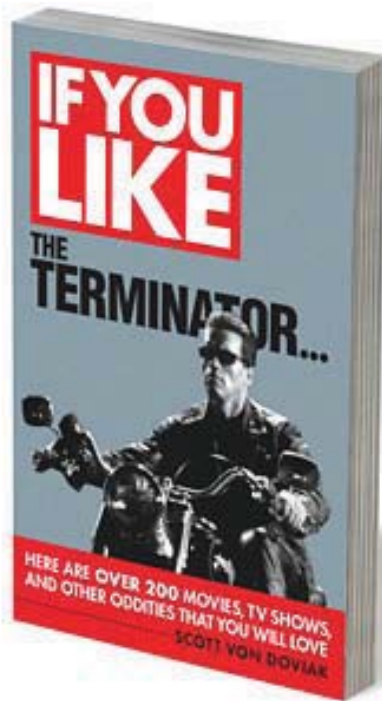

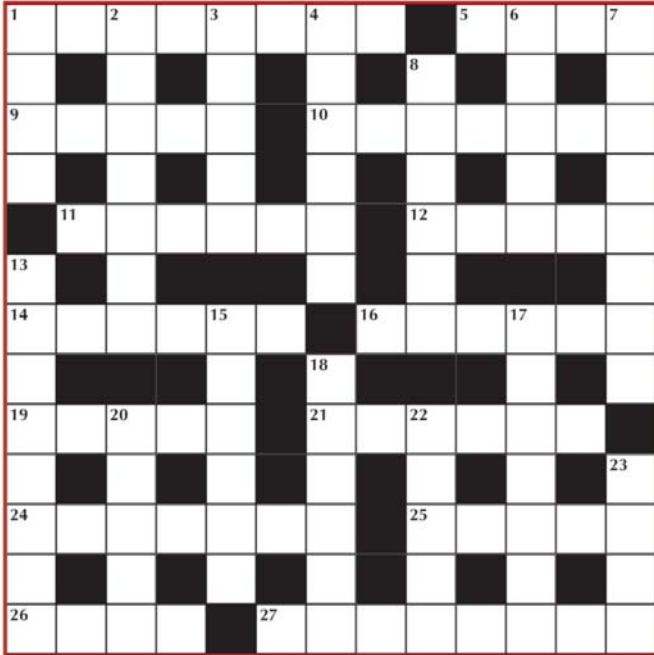

On top of using environmentally-friendly products and installing solar panels on his home, **Leonardo DiCaprio** and his family also started the Leonardo DiCaprio Foundation in 1998, which works to support efforts to secure a sustainable future for the world.

Grammy winner **Sting** has been an activist for over 30 years. While most of his early efforts focused on human rights, in 1989 he and his wife founded the Rainforest Foundation Fund to help save rainforests and to protect the rights of their indigenous inhabitants. The singer also holds an annual benefit concert featuring some of the biggest names in the music industry.

Daryl Hannah knows no limits when it comes to environmental activism. In 2006, after spending three weeks chained to a walnut tree, the actress was arrested for confronting authorities trying to destroy the largest urban farm in South Central Los Angeles. She

was arrested again in 2009 during a protest against a mountaintop removal in West Virginia and in 2011 for participating in a sit-in protest in front of the White House against the proposed installation of an oil pipeline.

On top of his busy acting schedule, **Edward Norton** is the president of the American branch of the Maasai Wilderness Conservation Trust, which works to protect the ecosystems and biodiversity of East Africa as well as the local Maasai communities. In 2010, Norton was named United Nations' Goodwill Ambassador for Biodiversity.

Brad Pitt and **Angelina Jolie** have received wide recognition for their support of political, humanitarian and environmental causes. In 2003, Jolie founded the Maddox Jolie Project, which was later renamed the Maddox Jolie-Pitt Foundation, to aid in community development and environmental conservation around the world.

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
